Changes to Medical Services Plan (MSP) Premiums

Please share this information with people in your organization who administer MSP coverage and need to be aware of changes to MSP premiums.

- Over the past 12 years, the provincial government has increased spending on health care by nearly 100 per cent. To help keep health care funding sustainable, MSP premium rates will be increased in January 2015 by approximately four per cent.
- Maximum monthly premium rates will increase by about four per cent or \$2.75 per month to a total of \$72.00 for single persons, by \$5.00 per month to a total of \$130.50 for two person families and by \$5.50 per month to a total of \$144.00 for families of three or more persons.
- Premium rates for those qualifying for Regular Premium Assistance will remain the same as premium assisted rates that came into effect January 1, 2012.
- MSP's Regular Premium Assistance program was enhanced January 2010. As a result, 2015 MSP rates for those receiving premium assistance remain lower than in 2009. Nearly one million British Columbians receive MSP subsidies, including more than 800,000 residents who pay no MSP premiums at all.
